Dear friends,

Happy Epiphany! "Epiphany" means an appearance or manifestation of the divine, such as the appearance of the Christ to the Gentile wise men, which we celebrate today. But it can also mean a revelation, realization or a discovery – an ah-ha moment – which is what our worship service will be about tonight at Iglesia Emanuel.

At the request of FPC's Session, Mark and I met with *Jimmie Hawkins*, minister of Covenant Presbyterian Church, to talk about ways that our congregations might come together and address the issues of race swirling around in our culture since the pivotal event in Ferguson, MO last summer. We came to the conclusion that Epiphany would be a good starting point to come together across racial lines, black, Hispanic and white, and seek discernment or epiphany as to how to move forward together towards healing in our community. If you wish to seek "wisdom" and

"epiphany" about next steps, **I invite you to join us for worship at 7:00 this evening at Iglesia Emanuel**, 2504 North Roxboro Street. Dinner will be served prior, at 6:30, including Three Kings Cake (from Cris and Beth), an epiphany tradition.

Sunday is an important day, too, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, and also re-affirm our baptismal vows to our nine confirmands at the half-way point in their journey. They are a great group of eighth and ninth graders, and I look forward to letting them hear from the congregation, but also letting you hear from them. They are the next generation of church leadership, and I consider it another type of epiphany to see the Christ in our future leaders.
