# FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

These past few weeks have been especially difficult in the life of our congregation, as we have experienced the deaths of some very beloved members, and the sudden illnesses of others. We can hardly carry on with our normal January agendas because we are pulled in so many different directions of caring. Or is this our January agenda: caring?

This Sunday, we will continue with the Jesus story, as Jesus meets his nemesis: either the man with an unclean spirit, . . . or an interruption. Either way, Jesus confronts them head-on, and apparently with noticeable authority, which makes the people gasp. We could make a case, it seems, that either the devil is in the interruptions, or that God is in the interruptions. And what about this interim period in the life of the congregation? Is it an interruption in "business as usual" for our church? Or is it God breaking into our routine and causing us to pause and reconsider our mission, the nature of our way of doing business on the corner of Main and Roxboro?

We'll ponder some of these things on Sunday. But in the meantime, and on into February, keep caring deeply for those whom we love, and keep praying profoundly for transformation in lives and in the life of our church.
