FROM THE

INTERIM PASTOR

One of the great blessings of my tenure at First Presbyterian Church is observing the membership's financial faithfulness, passion, and commitment to the Lord's work and the needs of others through your generosity. Budgetary challenges predictably have surfaced during the interim period, and the leadership and members of the congregation have likewise stepped up to address those challenges. Budget years 2014 and 2015 have required significant reassessments of spending patterns and priorities, resulting in budget reductions and cuts that have been sobering. The end result is that stewardship efforts have met the monetary goals of FPC for 2015 as we pursue God's call to ministry. Special thanks go to our Stewardship Committee and our Budget Committee for their great leadership!

February may seem late (or really early!) for us to be talking about budget and stewardship issues. Yet the reality for this congregation is that some people may be willing but are not able to make a financial commitment prior to the end of the calendar year. For FPC, that means the finalization of the calendar year budget does not take place until the end of January or sometimes even into late February.

An important message being broadcast by our Finance Committee is the strong position of FPC financially. The 2014 Budget anticipated using \$33,000 from reserves in order to meet our financial needs. Because of the careful use of financial resources by staff and committees, and the consistent giving of the congregation, **not one penny of the reserve funds was used in 2014**. As a matter of fact, those reserve funds grew!

In addition, members of this congregation are thinking ahead for the ministry of FPC by including this church in their wills through gifts and bequests. Those far-sighted saints are impacting the ministry today by what they chose to do yesterday. Would you consider making such an impact tomorrow by what you choose to do today?
