Dear friends,

Recently I came across something called the "New Church Planters Axiom." It goes like this: If you start a church, you may not get disciples. But if you begin with disciples, you may get a church.

LIVING WAGE CERTIFIED

First Presbyterian Church has applied to be "living wage certified" as part of a new effort in Durham that seeks to identify, acknowledge, and celebrate businesses that pay all of their employees a living wage. Launched in March 2015, the Durham Living Wage Project has now certified over 50 businesses and nonprofits in Durham that pay at least the living wage standard of \$12.33/hour established by ordinance by the Durham City and County. Durham Congregations in Action (DCIA) has already been certified, but First Presbyterian will be the first living wage certified congregation in **Durham.** The Durham Living Wage Project is a voluntary employer certification program that is sponsored by the People's Alliance Fund. The program is modeled after a successful effort in Asheville led by Just Economics that has already certified more than 375 local businesses.
