#### **ASSOCIATE PASTOR**

Back to back in succession at the end of May, we celebrate two great mysteries of faith. Last Sunday, we celebrated Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the early apostolic community and the birthday of the Church. We have been empowered to be witnesses to Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. This Sunday, we celebrate Trinity Sunday, the mystery of God who is one in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The common thread for both remembrances is God's love manifest among us. The Holy Spirit is the bond of unity and love between the Father and the Son in the Trinity. That same Spirit is given to us in the Church to hold us together. In the sacrament of Baptism, we are sealed with that loving Spirit enabling us to call God, Abba, and "Our Father who art in heaven."

In between Pentecost and Trinity Sunday, we as a nation set aside a day of memory, as we recall the men and women who have served our country in countless ways and most especially those who sacrificed their lives for our freedom, for our security, and for our peace. The remembrances of the 100th anniversary of World War I, and just recently May 8th victory day in Europe ending World War II, reinforce the poignant meaning of Memorial Day. A republic like ours will only be as strong as the commitment of its citizens to understand that our freedom and democracy are costly. If we enter into the true spirit of that day, we will have a teaching moment for our young people enabling them to grasp the challenge to be committed, engaged citizens.

May the One Triune God bless us and our memorials in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
