FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

On this Christmas week, I find myself thinking of Mary, great with child, packing her belongings for the trip to Bethlehem with Joseph, not knowing when she would give birth or where she would be staying. It unsettles me to think of all that she didn't know as she prepared to head out for the census-taking. The important thing, however, is what she *did* know and what gave her deep peace – that the angel Gabriel had appeared to her and spoke to her words that she would never have imagined in her wildest dreams. She was favored by God, the angel had said. She would conceive a child and give birth to the Son of God. This would happen because nothing was impossible with God.

"Here I am, the servant of the Lord;"

Mary responded to the angel Gabriel, "let it be with me according to your word."

In other words, "I trust God."

I wonder, during this Advent season of waiting and hoping, if we dare to trust what God is doing in our lives and in the world? I wonder if we believe, as Mary did, as the angel promised, that "nothing will be impossible with God." I wonder if our hearts are ready to say "yes" to God in the life we are called to live – a life of peace, a life of hope, a life of working for welcome, fairness, justice, and equity for all. I wonder if we have the Mary's trust that God, incarnate in Jesus Christ has come to turn the world around and Mary's courage to be an active part in bringing about peace on earth. Mary sings:

My heart shall sing of the day you bring. Let the fires of your justice burn. Wipe away all tears, for the dawn draws near, and the world is about to turn.[1]

In Christ, God is turning the world around. May we have the courage to follow Jesus and work for the coming of God's Kingdom of peace, hope, love, and joy, even here, even now. May God guide our efforts and keep us humble. May our eyes be set on Christ.
