"Blessings"

To live a spirituality of stewardship, day in and day out, means that we are conscious of how richly we have been blessed and how important it is to share our blessing with others. My experience over the years has consistently reaffirmed my conviction that those who are most aware of being blessed by God are those who are most generous and most joyful in sharing their blessings with others. Awareness of being blessed is the key to the kind of Gospel living we strive to embody as a church community. These thoughts were reinforced for me by the generosity of the June Service and Mission challenge and the reading of Chapter 8 of Paul's 2nd Letter to the Corinthians where he spoke of generosity and service. Once we have grasped how richly we are blessed by our generous God, there is never a question regarding our willingness to share those gifts generously with others.
