But really, the story of this scarf goes back much farther than that. And like most all good biblical stories, it starts with water . . .

When I am told of my baptism now, it seems like a scene from *The Lion King*. My small, still dripping head sealed with oil then held up to where the whole church could see who they had just blindly promised to care for and teach. But no matter how little they knew of me when they made those promises they, you, have still upheld your commitment to me even to this day.

Some of you know me as that kid in the Handbell Choir, or that kid who gets up every year or so to sing "O Lamb of God." And I know at least Sarah sees me as that rascal always running around with Matt Brockman. But when I got this scarf from the church, I could feel the love of everyone in the church wrapping warmly around me and saying again to me, what *Lori Pistor* said at my baptism, "You are Samuel Joseph Henry, child of the Covenant."

JUNE CHALLENGE - UPDATE

Thanks to the generous response of the congregation, First Presbyterian's June Challenge grant raised \$21,500, which an anonymous donor matched with an additional \$20,000. The bulk of the funds will go to Downtown outreach (\$10,000 for FPC's Walk-In Assistance and \$10,000 for Step-Up Ministries, which is expanding its iob and life skills training program to Durham) and Presbytery (\$10,000). An additional \$5000 will go to PCUSA World Mission, \$2500 to Meals on Wheels, and \$500 to Iglesia Emanuel's youth group for college trips. The remaining funds may go to Presbyterian Urban Ministries, which assists in administering our walk-in assistance, or other Downtown outreach. The committee extends its deepest gratitude to the congregation for always responding with compassion to those in need in our community, state, and around the world. – *Lea Bingham*
