First Sunday of Lent Valentine's Day

If you are like me, you are probably feeling caught by surprise that Lent is here ALREADY! It seems like we just finished Christmas! But that's what happens when Easter, as the cornerstone of the church year, is a variable date and falls early. This year, Easter Sunday will be on March 27th.

So, on this first Sunday of Lent I ask you to go into the desert and ask yourself what connection does the dying and rising of Jesus Christ have with our daily lives? I encourage you to spend these 40 days focused on responding to this question which captures the essence of this time of fasting, prayer and penance. For most of us and most of the time, the "dying and rising" we encounter is clothed in very ordinary garb. We miss so much that is deeply significant if we look for the mystery of Christ in us only in the spectacular or extraordinary events of life. Rather, it is in the everyday, the mundane and ordinary, that most of us discover the presence of Jesus, dying and rising in us over and over again. May this Lenten season be for you a time of wonderful discovery of that mystery at work in your life.
