

PARKING LOT SAFETY


As part of FPC's ongoing plans to improve security and safety on our entire campus, we have developed a plan to improve safety and traffic flow in the parking lot. Unfortunately, there have been some frightening near misses in and around our parking lot lately. The following plan will help address many issues.

- People traveling in two directions in front of the Day School pose a real hazard for parents and their children during pick up and drop off times.
- Drivers trying to exit onto Roxboro
 Street while others are trying to enter
 create very dangerous traffic back-ups
 along that street, resulting in frustrated
 drivers pulling out and around the
 stopped cars at high speed.
- Drivers crossing Roxboro Street onto Parrish Street as they leave our property are actually going the wrong way on a one-way road and can be ticketed for it. This has caused some near misses and the Sheriff's Department has spoken to us about this situation on more than one occasion.

To address these problems, we will soon change to a one-way traffic pattern in our lot, as well as add signage and a crosswalk in front of the

Day School. The <u>only</u> <u>entrance</u> to our lot will be from Liberty Street. The <u>only exit</u> will be onto Roxboro Street. Drivers coming north on Roxboro



Our parking lot will be sealed and restriped soon. We will have arrows painted on the lot to help with traffic flow and a crosswalk painted in front of the Day School. We will put up Enter Only, Exit Only, and Right Turn Only signs where appropriate. Our handicapped spaces will be obvious and well-marked. We anticipate and appreciate your full cooperation with these new traffic patterns. Thank you, Property Committee
