
WHO IS JESUS?

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

Wow. What an exciting Labor Day weekend service of worship we had on Sunday! I expect many of you have heard about the fire alarm going off toward the end of the sermon, the firefighters in worship, and the evacuation. We finished worship under the crepe myrtles on a beautiful mid-Sunday. I hope you have also heard about what happened before the fire alarm went off. Our own Jane Williams accompanied the sermon (on Jeremiah 18:1-11) which was about God as potter. She threw two beautiful pots on her potter's wheel while I preached on the way God shapes and forms us in our lives. The podcast will prove to be interesting but a little confusing as there are frequent long pauses as I stopped to watch Jane work. It also will be interrupted by a fire alarm. :)

As a few people in the front and back of the sanctuary began to smell smoke, we evacuated the sanctuary and reassembled outside to sing and pray together the end of our worship. As we worshiped together in this surprising place, it became clear to many of us gathered that God was in our midst and that even in the chaos (perhaps always in the chaos) God is present. We know this when we pause long enough to recognize it.

After the service concluded, one of you pointed out to me the words we had said together in our Affirmation of Faith that morning: "We acknowledge God's care and control in the regularity of the universe as well as in apparently random happenings." Seems that on Sunday we had a chance to show that we not only acknowledged God's care and control in apparently random happenings, but also enacted our belief in this!

Clearly, worship at FPC is not to be missed! One never knows what might happen and how the Holy Spirit might move. See you Sunday.
